How Neighborhoods Affect Children's Well-Being

- In neighborhoods that are unsafe, children watch more television, take part in fewer after-school activities, and are more likely to be overweight than children in safer communities^{2,3}
- Children who live in high-poverty neighborhoods are less likely than their peers to graduate from high school, and their adult earnings are lower⁴

assessment tool was designed to measure children's perceptions of violence in the family, particularly domestic violence Although the interview has been identified as a measure for children's exposure to violence in some publications, it does not ask direct questions about actual exposure to domestic violence

By establishing and enforcing rules that, for instance, limit how long children are watching television or on the computer, parents remind children that they have limits, and that the parent is in charge Setting limits helps build the child's respect for the parents
